Chair's Report

Joy reported that:

- No committee meetings will be held. Only board meeting will be on June 3 after the OAM event.
- Scott Spallina, Gary Simon, Beverly Jean Withington, John Tomoso are appointed to the board.
- Marilyn, Jim and Adele will be on the nominating committee.

PABEA Committees

*Legislative*

*(See attached for 2016 Final Tracking Report)*

Sarah mentioned that the committee needs to work collaboratively with advocacy groups and major stakeholders on aging issues to move forward and have a stronger, unified voice. The committee will form a small group with EOA and AAAs (Terri, Nalani, Deborah, Tony, John, Barbara, and a few others) to meet with other advocacy groups to prioritize the major issues and be more effective in the upcoming legislative session.

#### HB1700 (the State Budget bill)

- Increase the ceiling of the Method of Financing “P” in the amount of \$2.7 million. This will allow EOA to move forward with federal grants that have been awarded, including a federal No Wrong Door implementation grant award for \$2.5 million dollars.
- \$3 million for the Kupuna Care Program into the state’s base budget for a total of \$7.8 million (\$3 million is nonrecurring)
- Change in the means of financing for 1.8 positions from federal funds to general funds

#### HB1878 (omnibus bill)

- \$1.7 million for the ADRCs. It includes new evaluation development and reporting requirements.
- \$32 K for fall prevention activities

- Significant items that **did not** receive funding this session are:

- Healthy Aging
- Long Term Care Ombudsman positions
- Alzheimer’s coordinator
- Alzheimer’s public awareness campaign

- Task force for Paid Family Leave

#### *Plans and Projects Review*

Joy said the committee is continuing to work on the By-laws and statues. There’s some organizational type issues where PABEA may not be operating in compliance with HRS. In the next few weeks, need to contact the AG and come up with a legislative fix.

#### *Recognition and Awards*

Jim gave an update on OAM:

- The OAM event will be on June 3 Friday at Kahala Nui. Board members are to be there at 9a. The event is to start at 9:45a.
- Board member assignments were emailed out. Please submit an acknowledgement response to Jim.
- Decorations are from Star of the Sea students. They produced an intergenerational bridge expression of art and used for centerpieces.
- Donations are moving along.
- Transportation vans are available from/to the Capitol and the event. Please let Jim know if vans are needed by Sunday May 15.
- 1<sup>st</sup> general public release was sent out. Jim drafted a 2<sup>nd</sup> release if the other counties are interested.

#### Aging Network

#### *Executive Office on Aging*

Terri gave an update on EOA:

- EOA has officially 21 positions. Currently, 8 positions are vacant with the inability to recruit due to reorganization and the need to have position descriptions approved. Two staff are expected to retire this year. Terri will meet with Dr. Pressler on Monday as HRO needs additional resources.
- HBCS conference will on the week of August 29 in Washington DC. Many EOA staff and AAA will miss the September 2 PABEA meeting.

### *Elderly Affairs Division*

Nalani gave an update on EAD:

- Primary focus is on modifying position descriptions. Community Service Aid positions are lower SR. By July 1, EAD will be able to upgrade the positions.
- Partial bring case management in house. PDs have been reviewed by DHR and will request to fill by July 1.
- With the reporting requirements, the concern is reporting the data consistently across the state.
- EAD will be moving offices to Iwilei.
- Helpful to know budget allocation as providers' contracts end in June.

### *Maui County on Aging*

Deborah reported that:

- Need to capture data elements to show the effectiveness of ADRC. Terri offered to meet with Della to get a better understanding of the type of data the Legislature wants.
- MCOA will be able to draw down \$440,000/year of federal financial participation funds from Medicaid.
- 15<sup>th</sup> annual Caregiver Conference in November
- Hired staff on May 1 for Wellness Healthy Aging program

### Members Report

Melina from DCCA shared upcoming senior events.  
(See attached DCCA Event handout.)

Keith from DOH report that:

- OHCA asked for 9 positions: 3 were approved for Medicare resources (2 surveyors and 1 admin support).
- No licensing positions were approved.
- Full time posting position was not approved. Currently, posting reports have stopped as no additional resources are available.
- For unannounced inspections, the Department wanted clarity from the Legislature on statutory language that is currently stated on what OHCA is able to do. The bill didn't pass and OHCA will be looking at other options for the next Legislative session.
- For Medical Marijuana language, OHCA prefers that the annual relicensing visit also be unannounced.
- Formal letters have been sent out to the 8 selectees for Medical Marijuana. 7 selectees sent in payments for the licensing fees.

## OLD BUSINESS

Nathan gave an update on the Public Awareness Campaign.

- Reintroduce the bill package in 2017
- Looking at alternate means of funding; although the GET is the best viable option
- LTC Public Awareness Campaign is a public awareness campaign and not an advocacy campaign.
- Community and collaborative effort to get more people engaged and be more transparent to move forward.
- Need to look at the negative comments that were received. The feedback was that the legislators asked questions but it wasn't responded to.
- Repackage the LTC Financing information to a more simplified form as part of the on the PAC website.

Debbie gave an update on No Wrong Door.

- Next week, Debbie will be meeting with the consultants to draft protocols on person centered counseling.
- NWD has progress reporting requirements for the Legislature.

## NEW BUSINESS

Larry mentioned that the LTC Financing needs to respond to negative testimony and tax implications.

Charles Nagatoshi gave an update on HI SHIP program. Currently, the program only has 1 paid staff and 9 volunteers. The program is ranked 49 out of 54 in the nation. Priorities include rebuilding infrastructure (written standard operating procedures and recruitment manuals and training activities) and to increase the number of volunteers.
