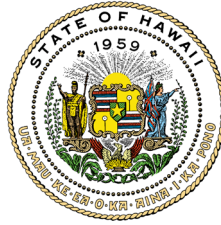

 - a. June is Elder Justice Awareness Month. Webinars are being hosted by the Administration for Community Living for professionals, advocates, and the community to raise awareness about elder justice.
